TO THE RESIDENTS OF LIGHTHOUSE POINT THE CITY OF LIGHTHOUSE POINT AND YOUR POLICE DEPARTMENT NEED YOUR SUPPORT

As many of you are aware, the need for a new and modern police facility is critical to continue to provide exceptional law enforcement services to our community that we all expect and deserve. As a resident of our fine community and as the Chief of Police, I can tell you that the excellent level of police service provided to our citizens has more to do with motivated and dedicated employees and less to do with buildings and equipment. However, a critical need exists to replace our present building that facilitates the daily law enforcement functions in our community.

The police department building was constructed in 1965, and in addition to being functionally inadequate, it is in desperate need of very expensive repairs. These repairs have been put off during the last few years because of previous promises to build a new facility. The repairs include but are not limited to a new roof, new plumbing, new electrical wiring throughout, and functional changes to be in compliance with federal law as well as modern day law enforcement practices. Our existing facility has inadequate storage for the safe keeping of public records, inadequate restrooms for employees and no restrooms for the public. In addition, the air conditioning system is and continues to be inadequate and needs reengineering. Due to the poor quality of air conditioning, half of the building is too hot and the other half of the building is too cold. To make matters worse, there has been an unsolvable rodent problem in the police attic for years.

In all modern day law enforcement facilities "life safety systems" are crucial. Presently, there are no fire sprinkler systems or alarm systems. This presents liability to the City, especially within areas such as holding cells where prisoners are detained prior to transport, and where records, investigations and evidence are stored.

You may or may not know that your police department consists of 41 full-time employees, four crossing guards and 15 volunteers. It may surprise some to know that during a weekday it is not unusual to have 16 to 18 people working within the building. Additionally, numerous people frequent our facility day and night, which include victims of

crimes, witnesses, as well as those who need to purchase permits or pay fees. Annually our officers respond to over 10,000 calls for service and make in excess of 250 arrests, the majority of which are processed at our police facility. In other words, we are a full-service police agency that needs a professional facility that represents the high standards expected in our community.

In June of 2000, the Police Department received accredited status from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, which recognizes standards necessary of a professional police department. However, it was well documented that the existing facility barely met compliance with standards and would require major renovations to meet re-accreditation in the future. By 2003, our department will have to conform to more stringent recognized industry standards for professional law enforcement that minimize risk and liability to the City. Since we recognize that our building will not meet these standards in the future, we may be forced at some point to reduce or eliminate certain processes which may include the booking and questioning of adult and juvenile offenders in our station, which lessens our effectiveness as a law enforcement agency. Since our statewide accreditation status may be in jeopardy, the city could have increased liability and exposure to lawsuits.

It is my perception that the people in Lighthouse Point want to have local professional police officers who are responsive to their needs. Fortunately, we enjoy the reputation of having one of the safest cities in South Florida, and that reputation is as a result of dedicated professionals that serve this community. It is the opinion of myself, a Mayor-formed task force, architectural experts and the entire City Commission, that it is time to replace our antiquated and inefficient building. The administration is planning to include funding for a new police building in a capital improvement bond issue to be placed on the ballot at the next general election in March 2002. I am asking that the residents of Lighthouse Point educate themselves concerning this issue. ▲

IT'S TIME TO REFORM CITY ELECTIONS


Under the existing Charter for the City of Lighthouse Point, all five City Commissioners are elected on an "at large" basis and serve for a term of three years effective with the March 2002 general election. We have what is commonly referred to as "pack voting" in which all incumbents facing re-election and all challengers run against each other in a jumbled pack with the top two or three vote-getters winning the election.

In an editorial in February 2001 the Sun Sentinel referred to "pack voting" as being "extremely harmful" because it reduces the voters' ability to hold one incumbent accountable for performance. It also discriminates against outside challengers forcing them to run

against all incumbents plus all other challengers. It also increases the likelihood of under votes and over votes, because voters may accidentally fail to vote for all two or three candidates or may deliberately cast a "bullet" vote for a single candidate hurting election chances of other candidates who would otherwise get their votes.

The Sun Sentinel recommends that cities using this system should move promptly to require candidates to run for specific seats. This can be done with an amendment to the City Charter which could be placed on the ballot for voter approval at the March 2002 general election. 📌

TRAFFIC CALMING AND COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT COMMITTEE

The Traffic Calming and Community Enhancement Committee was formed in May 2001 with the specific assignment of submitting specific written recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission for improvements throughout the City. Utilizing studies conducted by the Vision Committee and the former Community Enhancement Task Force, the Committee will focus on projects for traffic

WATERWAY COMMITTEE

This year's event will be held on November 17th and 18th, 2001 and is the 12th year for this popular event. Since we've outgrown all locations in Lighthouse Point we joined with the City of Pompano Beach three years ago and hold the event at the Pompano Community Park, 820 N.E. 18th Avenue, Pompano Beach. Last year approximately \$10,000 was raised and in the past monies from the flea market have been used for canal dredging, purchasing of boats for the city's youth sailing program, et cetera.



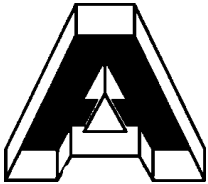
